

As we move away from non-renewable energy, more of our power will come from renewable resources such as the wind and sun. Getting energy from these sources, however, requires a method of storing it. Batteries can do this, but they're expensive. The International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) is developing another more affordable option called BEST. It stands for Buoyancy Energy Storage Technology.

If you pull a beach ball under water, it floats back up to the surface. BEST uses a similar idea. It starts a power generator by using buoyancy, the energy of an object quickly rising to the water's surface. The ambitious design uses a cube made out of a huge number of pipes. Each pipe is used for the storage of buoyant energy. The pipes are pulled down toward the bottom of the ocean, where the energy is stored. When it's time to release the energy, the pipes are let go. They float back up to the surface as if they were giant beach balls, pulling an electric motor. This turns it into a generator that provides power. It will take time before BEST is widely used. Nevertheless, it shows great promise.
