

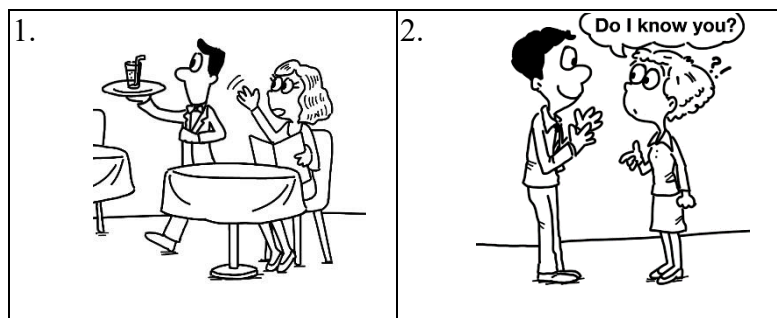

In 1994, a tragedy shook the small African country of Rwanda. In 100 days, around 800,000 people were killed by their fellow citizens. Most of these people were Tutsis, one of the two largest ethnic groups in Rwanda. Until 1959, Tutsis had held most of the power in Rwanda. By 1973, a government led by Hutus, the biggest ethnic group, was in charge. When President Juvénal Habyarimana was killed in 1994, Hutu militias jumped into action.

Now, 27 years later, French president Emmanuel Macron has publicly taken responsibility for his country's role in the violence. At the time of the massacre, France sent soldiers to set up a safe area, but they didn't do enough. France knew political tensions were increasing and had even noticed preparations for a genocide. However, the country did not speak out, and supported the racist, violent president of Rwanda at the time.

In a May visit to Kigali, the Rwandan capital, Macron gave a speech. He did not apologize, but he admitted France's failures and offered an apologetic gesture. As part of France's investigation into the part it played in the 1994 massacre, many useful documents were collected. Macron opened this archive to be shared with Rwandan researchers and survivors.

As we move away from non-renewable energy, more of our power will come from renewable resources such as the wind and sun. Getting energy from these sources, however, requires a method of storing it. Batteries can do this, but they’re expensive. The International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) is developing another more affordable option called BEST. It stands for Buoyancy Energy Storage Technology. If you pull a beach ball under water, it floats back up to the surface. BEST uses a similar idea. It starts a power generator by using buoyancy, the energy of an object quickly rising to the water’s surface. The ambitious design uses a cube made out of a huge number of pipes. Each pipe is used for the storage of buoyant energy. The pipes are pulled down toward the bottom of the ocean, where the energy is stored. When it’s time to release the energy, the pipes are let go. They float back up to the surface as if they were giant beach balls, pulling an electric motor. This turns it into a generator that provides power. It will take time before BEST is widely used. Nevertheless, it shows great promise.
